Pre-conference session held at Set sail for quality on an ocean of caring

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Introduction

The Canadian Child Care Federation conference *Set Sail for Quality on an Ocean of Caring* was held on June 16-17, 2007 in Halifax, Canada. Prior to the conference (June 15) a pre-conference session *Broadening and deepening our understanding of quality: Working toward inclusion and equity* was offered. Conference presenters raised critical questions about how we can understand quality beyond definitions of accountability, accreditation, quality assurance, and rating scales. In understanding quality, presenters stressed the importance of taking into account different voices, perspectives and experiences and of providing evidence of inclusive and equitable outcomes in the everyday experiences and participation of children, early childhood educators and families.

The conference session was a further step in building a community of Canadian thinkers, researchers, policy makers and front-line early childhood educators committed to broadening and deepening understandings of quality in early childhood education and child care. It is hoped that the conference proceedings will provide one way to further a pan-Canadian dialogue on quality.
